- 6. Poor timing and unrealistic expectations



Understand yourself




Understand the other party (to the best of your ability)

How you Communicate matters!



How you communicate matters!

- 1. Method of communication--their preference
- 2. Consistent message (content, tone, body language)
- 3. Separate facts from assumptions
- 4. Timing no distractions
- 5. Listen and observe, keep dialogue "safe"
- 6. Follow up who will do what by when
